

Jamie's story

20 years old

Jamie was an innocent victim of a highly dangerous known offender.

Jamie was killed in a sustained and brutal attack. He was only 20 years old.

During the trial at the Old Bailey, the court heard Jamie and the defendant [Jones] were seen returning to the Fitze Millennium Centre housing and support facility, and CCTV showed them going into Jones' room. Jamie was never seen alive again.

Giving evidence at the trial, Jones said he acted in self-defence. He also denied dismembering Jamie's body.

At the time of the murder, the defendant was on licence having been released from prison six days before he murdered Jamie.

After a two month-trial, jurors unanimously found Jones guilty of murder. He was sentenced to life imprisonment with a minimum term of 27 years.
